Introduction

Long before the introduction of civil registration of births, marriages and deaths in Scotland in 1857, the Scotlish church maintained excellent records of the births and marriages within each parish, making it possible to trace a lot of Scotlish ancestral lines back many generations.

The Scottish surname McIntosh is a variation of the Clan MackIntosh, which originated around Inverness in the Scottish Highlands.


This document is focussed on my wife's McIntosh ancestors. The story begins in Rathven Parish, in the County of Banffshire, Scotland, in the late 1800s, and is intended to provide a general overview of the many descendant branches of our McIntosh family tree. There will be more information on my wife's immediate family, and their story, as that is what I am most familiar with, but I hope that it will also provide a better understanding of the other descendant lines, and how we are all related.

Throughout the document, to protect their privacy, I have tried to avoid providing details of living relatives, and I apologize if this cut-off has not been perfectly executed.

This is not intended to be the final word on the McIntosh family of Banffshire, and I hope that over time, new information will be identified, and that people from the various descendant branches might add additional chapters to this document, expanding the story of their McIntosh lines.

I apologise for any errors that may have crept into the document, and I welcome any corrections, family photographs, or other feedback.

The chart on the next page shows with yellow highlight, the ancestral line that is the focus of this document.




Chapter 1 – The Early Generations

The earliest record that I have found of my wife's McIntosh ancestors, is the baptism of James McIntosh on 28 February 1797 at Elizabeth Castle, St Helier, on the island of Jerseyⁱ.

James McIntosh 1797 Baptism

James McIntosh was a son of Elizabeth Arbuthnot and James McIntosh. James McIntosh senior was a soldier in Captain Smith's Independent Company of Invalids, one of 30 independent units in the British army at the time. James and Elizabeth McIntosh had at least one other child, Mary, born at St. Fergus, Banffshire in 1788.




At some point the family returned to Scotland, as on 24 July 1828, James McIntosh junior married Janet Gillan in the parish church at Huntly, Aberdeenshire. This marriage produced nine children, all born at Huntly, as follows –

- James McIntosh, born 23 October 1828
- Helen McIntosh, born 29 November 1831
- Ann McIntosh, baptised 10 August 1833
- Mary Ann McIntosh, born circa 1834
- Elisabeth McIntosh, born circa 1837



I have not researched any of these children extensively, apart from the eldest and youngest children, James and Charles McIntosh, who will be covered in more detail in the next two chapters.

James McIntosh (b.1797) worked as a farm labourer, in addition to receiving an army pension, and died in Aberdeen on 27 February 1864, two years after his wife Jane who died 16 October 1862.



Chapter 2 – James McIntosh and Christina Forsyth



James McIntosh married Christina (Christian) Forsyth in the parish of Marnoch, Aberdeenshire on 4 December 1852. This marriage produced nine children and details of their descendants were received from other researchers – Stuart McIntosh and Robert McIntosh.


James McIntosh died at the age of 86 years, at Newhills, Aberdeenshire on 13 January 1915. His wife, Christina, died just 5 months later, on 20 June 1915, also at Newhills, aged 84 years.

Chapter 3 - Charles McIntosh and Isabella Moir



Charles McIntosh had a child with Jessie Hay, born 27 January 1882 at Strathdon, Aberdeenshire, and named Charles John McIntosh. Charles John McIntosh married twice and his known descendants are as follows –

A year and a half after the illegitimate birth of his son, Charles John McIntosh, Charles McIntosh married Isabella Moir, on 10 August 1883 at Rathven, Banffshire. They settled in Rathven and their marriage produced at least 15 children as follows –

Nine of the 15 children married and had families of their own and they will be covered in later chapters. Of the remaining children –

Elsie Copland McIntosh died at Rathven in 1889 at one year old.

James McIntosh immigrated to Toronto, Ontario, Canada, where he married Kate Hutchinson on 5 March 1913. James and Kate had a son named James, born 17 April 1914, but died the same day. James McIntosh (Regimental No. 28062) attested at Toronto on 23 September 1914 for the 48th Regiment (Highlanders), and his unit sailed for Europe on 3 October 1914. James was wounded at the Battle of Langemarck and subsequently died of his wounds on the 28th of April, 1915 at Boulogne, France. His widow, Kate, later married Louis Farquhar.


William Crawford McIntosh died at Rathven in 1912 at 18 years of age.

John Milne McIntosh died at Rathven in 1898 at one year old.


Alexander William Smith McIntosh died at Rathven in 1901 prior to his first birthday.

Ruth McIntosh died at Rathven in 1906 at two years old.

Their father, Charles McIntosh, spent his working life as a Mason's labourer and died at Buckie on 25 June 1913 at about 59 years of age. His widow, Isabella, lived on for 15 years, and died at Rathven on her 66th birthday, 31st of May 1928.



Chapter 4 – Helen Margaret McIntosh




Helen Margaret McIntosh, the eldest child of Charles McIntosh and Isabella Moir, was born at Rathven, on 4 December 1882. She married James Alexander Mair on 22 August 1918, and their marriage produced two children, as follows –



Chapter 5 – Isabella Moir McIntosh and Frederick William Sim



Isabella Moir McIntosh, the second child of Charles McIntosh and Isabella Moir, was born at Rathven on 28 May 1884, and by 1901 the sixteen year old Isabella was working as a domestic servant.

In the early 1900s, Isabella Moir McIntosh, went to work for Frederick William Sim, son of Alexander Sim, a banker of Cullen, as his housekeeper at Maryhill Farm, and Isabella became pregnant soon after. When her son was born at Mid Street, Keith, on 7 March 1907, Isabella named him James Stuart McIntosh, and on the birth registration, the father's name is blank.

This illegitimate birth would have caused some angst in Isabella's family, and as Alexander Sim had died the previous January, Isabella's father, Charles McIntosh, must have had discussions with Alexander's widow, about Fred taking responsibility for the child, as on 2 June 1908, Isabella and Fred were quietly married in Aberdeen, by order of the Sheriff, before being shipped off to Canada on the *S.S. Grampian*, which sailed from Glasgow on 6 June, headed to Montreal. It appears that Fred and family did not sail on the *S.S. Grampian* as planned, instead sailing first class on the *S.S. Pretorian*, which left Glasgow on 5 September. In the meantime, Fred was declared bankruptⁱⁱ.

When Fred's mother made her will on 9 April 1908, she left nothing to Fred, and the will states "...I would here state that the reason why I have not included my Son Frederick William Sim as participating in my Estate is that I have since his Father's death had to pay for him considerable sums for which I became security for him on Bills...".

A story passed down in one branch of the family is that Fred and Isabella lived in the Royal York Hotel in Toronto for two years after arriving in Canada, which must have been a challenge, given that Fred had declared bankruptcy in Scotland, so perhaps his mother was footing the bill?

Regardless, reality eventually set in and Fred moved his family west to Saskatchewan in 1910, taking a position as a Police Constable with the Saskatchewan Provincial Police.

Whilst living in Saskatchewan, Fred and Isabella had five additional children, as follows –

- Audrey Jean Sim, born 7 October 1926

Fred also worked at the Prince Albert Correctional Institution, the Carlton Indian Reserve and the Weyburn Mental Institution, but in 1929, he moved his family to Red Deer, Alberta, where Fred was employed by the city police force for a number of years. He died in Red Deer on 4 July 1946 after a long illness, and is buried in the Red Deer Cemetery.

The first son of Fred and Isabella, born as James Stuart McIntosh, was raised as Frederick William Sim junior. As he approached retirement age, Fred junior asked his mother if she had a copy of his birth certificate. She replied that they could not get a copy of his birth certificate, as the church where he was baptised had burned down. However, Isabella quietly wrote to the General Register Office in Scotland and amended Fred's birth record, changing the name on the registration record from James Stuart McIntosh to Frederick William Sim.

Another story passed down in the family, is that if Isabella needed a new dress for an event, Fred would order five dresses from the Sears Catalogue. Isabella would choose the one that she wanted to wear to the event, and after the event Fred would return all five to Sears.

Isabella Moir Sim, nee McIntosh, died at the University Hospital in Edmonton, Alberta, on 28 April 1971, aged 86 years. She is buried in the Red Deer Cemetery alongside her late husband.





Chapter 6 – Margaret Ann McIntosh and James Ralph Hartley



Margaret Ann McIntosh, the third child of Charles McIntosh and Isabella Moir was born in Rathven on 5 September 1885.

On 19 May 1909, Margaret gave birth to an illegitimate son, whom she named William Maitland McIntosh. The father of the child is not named on the birth registration. William Maitland McIntosh was adopted out and he married Peggy Hilda Parker in Colchester, Essex, in 1948. He died in Colchester on 6 May 1956.

In April 1910, Margaret McIntosh sailed on the ship *Sicilian* from Glasgow, arriving in Quebec City, Canada on 27 April 1910. The passenger record states that she was taking the Canadian Pacific Railway to Calgary, Alberta. It is unknown whether or not she travelled all the way to Calgary, but on 24 October 1910 she married James Ralph Hartley in Winnipeg, Manitoba.

The marriage produced three children, all born in Winnipeg, as follows –



Chapter 13 – Frederick William Sim (1907 – 1974)



Frederick William Sim junior was born 7 March 1907 at 177a Mid Street, Keith, Banffshire, Scotland, the only child of Fred Sim and Isabella Moir McIntosh to be born in Scotland, before their emigration to Canada in 1908. As he was born prior to his parents' marriage, his birth name was registered as James Stuart McIntosh, but the record was later amended to change his name to Frederick William Sim, the name that he was known by throughout his life.

After leaving high school, Fred joined Canadian National Railways as a Labourer and was posted to Warman, Saskatchewan. It was here that he met Elsie Rosa Woods, daughter of the local C.N. Station Master, Ernest Charles Woods. Elsie became pregnant and the parents whisked them off to Saskatoon, where they were married on 3 July 1929, by the local Presbyterian Minister, with Fred's mother and Elsie's father as witnesses.

Fred was soon transferred to Forgan, Saskatchewan, followed by Birtle, Manitoba, and around 1937 he was transferred to Loverna, Saskatchewan. Fred and Elsie had nine children, all born in Forgan and Loverna, Saskatchewan, except for Audrey, as follows –

The family was only in Birtle, Manitoba for a short time, but it was here that the fourth child, Audrey, was born in 1935, and sadly died three months later from pneumonia. So they were probably relieved to be transferred to Loverna, and put the tragedy behind them.

Life in Loverna was good for the Sim family. Fred was always working at something, whether at CN or at home, where they had large gardens, and he also found time to cut the hair of some of the local men, and to make and maintain outdoor ice rinks for the town children in the winter. In 1945 he was elected to the position of Mayor of Loverna.

Tragedy struck in 1950, when their thirteen year old daughter Shirley, died of leukemia. This put a huge strain on Fred and Elsie, from which their relationship did not recover. By 1958, Fred

was living in Saskatoon, working as a maintenance foreman at the National Research Council, and in 1967 they officially divorced.

Frederick William Sim died in Saskatoon on 30 July 1974, at 67 years of age.

Elsie initially remained in Loverna with the younger children, but after the house burned down, she moved into town and found work at the Canadian Forces base in Alsask.

After her divorce from Fred, Elsie Sim married Gordon Scott (Pat) Aasen and the couple lived at Alsask. Pat died 14 December 1996 and Elsie died 18 July 2000.

Rosa Isabella, the eldest child of Fred and Elsie Sim married twice, firstly to Tom McFee in 1951, but the marriage ended in divorce, and Rosa later married Clifford Hogberg.

Rosa was an excellent curler, and won many tournaments. She did not have any children from either marriage and died in Edmonton, Alberta on 5 April 1985.

Neil MacIntosh Sim joined the Royal Canadian Air Force and rose to the rank of Warrant Officer. He married Bernadette Boyer in North Bay, Ontario on 3 July 1965, but they did not have any children together. Neil died at Ottawa General Hospital on 2 August 1998.

Fredda Iris Sim was working in Rosetown. Saskatchewan when she met Gerald Arthur (Gerry) Spriggs and they married in Rosetown in 1953, as Gerry was in the process of being transferred to Foam Lake, Saskatchewan. They moved to Foam Lake the following week, and it was there that their daughter Marlene Lynn (my wife), and son, Arthur William, were born, before Gerry was transferred to Regina (1957), Montreal (1965), Calgary (1966), Montreal (1969), Toronto (1976) and Winnipeg (1982). Their third child, Robert Gerald, was born in Montreal. After retirement, Gerry and Fredda relocated to Cloverdale, British Columbia, to enjoy the coastal climate. But Gerry's golden years were cut short and he died in 1989 at his daughter's house in Calgary, Alberta, and he is buried there in the Queen's Park cemetery.

Through a mutual friend, Fredda met Nicholas (Nick) Karbonik, a widower with three adult children, living in Calgary, and they married in Calgary on 8 February 1992. Fredda and Nick soon moved to Nanaimo, British Columbia, where they lived an active retirement, playing a lot of golf and travelling. Nick passed away suddenly in Nanaimo on 17 August 2018, and Fredda continues to live in Nanaimo.




Chapter 14 - DNA Testing

The foregoing chapters have identified many of the descendants of James McIntosh, born before 1770, based primarily on public records. So it would be nice to be able to confirm the validity of the ancestral lines as researched.

Autosomal DNA testing, through companies such as Ancestry, 23andMe, My Heritage and FamilyTreeDNA, is of huge benefit to genealogists in confirming familial connections identified by researching the paper trail of our ancestors. If two people who have well-researched family trees, which identify a common ancestor, also share autosomal DNA, and if there is no other obvious ancestral connection, then it is highly likely that the identified common ancestor is correct.

Through comparison of the autosomal DNA results of my mother in law, Fredda Iris Sim, with the results of others who have taken DNA tests (DNA matches), I have found several McIntosh cousins who were previously unknown to me, including descendants of two of the other children of James McIntosh and Janet Gillan. So autosomal DNA testing has been instrumental in confirming my wife's McIntosh ancestry. Identification of shared DNA between Fredda Sim and McIntosh line relatives at the first, second, and third cousin levels supports the researched ancestral line back to James McIntosh and Janet Gillan.

The chart below shows several of Fredda's McIntosh connections confirmed with autosomal DNA testing, but not all known DNA connections have been included in the chart to improve readability.

There are many other people who have taken autosomal DNA tests, with whom Fredda shares significant amounts of DNA, and with whom it appears that she may share a common McIntosh ancestor, but unfortunately there is no paper trail to establish the correct relationship.

It is unlikely (less than 32%) that relatives beyond fifth cousins will share significant amounts of autosomal DNA, so for more distant connections on the male ancestral line, Y-DNA testing could also be very useful.

The Y-chromosome is passed down the male line from father to son, largely unchanged, although mutations do occur from time to time. It is these mutations that create what is termed "genetic distance" between Y-DNA samples – the genetic distance between two samples increases by one with each mutation on either line of descent from a common ancestor. The relative stability of the Y-chromosome is therefore useful in identifying common male ancestors in ancient times.

I therefore encourage male McIntosh descendants to take the Big Y-700 test at FamilyTreeDNA, or even the somewhat cheaper Y-111 test, which could help to clarify how our McIntosh family fits into the overall haplotree of humankind. These tests are frequently on sale, especially around Black Friday in November and immediately after Christmas.

To date I am not aware of any Banffshire McIntosh male descendants who have taken Y-DNA tests, so even one person testing would be useful, and several, from different lines of descent would be a bonus.
